For the past seven years he has supported doctoral supervisors and those who train them at many universities on three continents. Rob is also the academic director of the Research Leadership Programme at his home university, the University of South-Eastern Norway. With Dr Anne Lee, he has published an edited volume on *The Future of Doctoral Research* (Routledge 2021).

Dr Mona Sæbø is Associate Professor from the Department on Natural Sciences at USN, and she has been collaborating with SPPU since 2011. She has been involved in several research and educational project between SPPU and USN. She has also been working closely with Rob for the last seven years as part of a team developing doctoral supervision.
